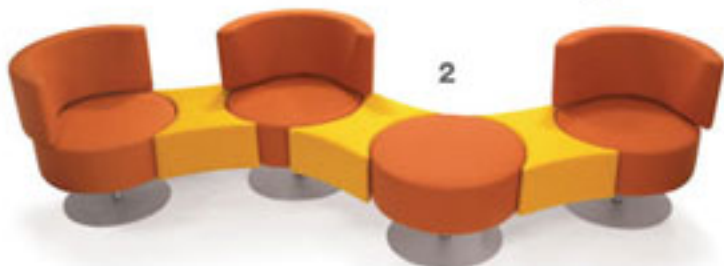

1. Sutherland by Starck: Rebel With A Chic Cause

In collaboration with ingenious designer Philippe Starck, David Sutherland presents the 'Sutherland by Starck RobinWood Deluxe' collection. This is outdoor furniture at its finest! RobinWood is named after Robin Hood, the ultimate rebel and in this regard, the collection does go against the grain. Teak combined with aluminium is hardy but elegant.



2. Edge Design: Over The Edge

The David Santachiara's Atoma is a range of circular units designed for Rossin and retailed by UK-based Edge. With a back profiled for casual, relaxed seating, these stand-alone units provide 360° rotation on a robust metal base. Singular units can be linked to create various configurations suitable for use in a public area.



3. Lyx: An Organic Twist

The Topografi bench designed by Jonas Wannfors is an organic piece of furniture suitable for indoor or outdoor use. It can be combined in various ways by attaching three modules – straight, exchange and end – to create a piece that is totally unique. The indoor version is made of MDF-cut board and industrial felt while the outdoor version is made of water-cut fibre cement board.



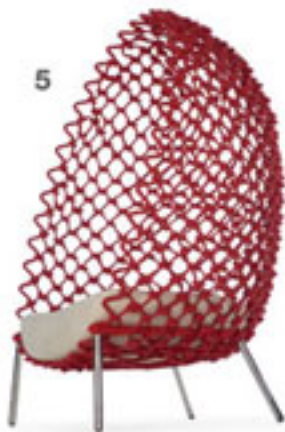
4. Schamburg + Alvisse Design: Smooth and Comfortable

The Smooth Tub Chair can be used in an office environment or in a restaurant and bar lounge area. With its bright upholstery, the chair is fun and begs to be used. With a stainless steel base and shell made of polyurethane foam, the chair is robust and easy to clean. Buyers can opt for a non-swivel four-star base or a swivel disc base.



5. Kenneth Cobonpue: An Intricate Web

The Dagnet lounge chair, designed by Pratt graduate and award-winning Philippine designer Kenneth Cobonpue, can be used indoors or outdoors. For indoor use, polycotton fabric is twisted and wrapped around a galvanised steel frame. Alternatively, a fabric called Sunbrella acrylic is used if the chair is meant for outdoor use. Colours come in red, yellow or black. The entire set comprises side chairs, a coffee table, an end table and dining table.



6. Industrial Facility: Enchord

Designed by London-based Industrial Facility, the dual-level Enchord desk allows the end-user to utilise a second level storage space in an instant. The pullout horizontal panel can also be used to put a printer or maintained as storage space. Designer Kim Colin (who co-founded the design firm with partner Sam Hecht) said, "We were inspired to design a table that was functional and flexible to match people's lives, yet be simple, understated, and elegant – not over-engineered or too dramatic – so it fits in multiple environments."



7. Ben Buettner Furniture: Super Nova

Available in outdoor and indoor versions, the Nova Furniture Line has a unique cantilevered design. The indoor version is seamlessly constructed in cold rolled steel with Black Walnut wood and upholstery. The outdoor version is made of stainless steel, teak, and upholstery. It can also be made-to-order according to the kind of wood specified.
